Pool Rentals

Birthday? Team Party? Group Celebration? Rent the pool! You get the entire pool and pool house to yourself, and two to three lifeguards depending upon the size of your party. Reservations taken over the phone must be paid in 24 hours to secure the date.

One hour: \$45 **Two hours: \$80**

You can also reserve the shelter thru the pool office. We require a \$25.00 deposit that is returned after the area has been cleaned and trash taken to the dumpster. Call the pool for availability.

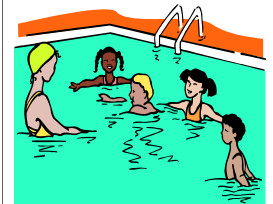
Swim Lessons

We provide swim lessons for ages three and older. This season we will offer four sessions. Sessions are 1/2 hour classes, five days a week for two weeks.

Prices are per child \$40 - Members \$60 - Non Members

Sign up at the pool office during regular pool hours. Payment is due upon signing up to hold your child's place in the class. Classes will be held at 10:00, 10:30; 11:00 and 11:30. Levels and classes will be determined by the demand and will be assigned the Thursday before each session. Parents will be called the Friday before classes begin with times for their child. All instructors are WSI (Water Safety Instructor) trained. Private lessons are also available. We are currently signing up for sessions 2- 4 of swim lessons. The deadline to secure a spot in any session is the Wednesday before the new session begins

Maximum Occupancy

Maximum occupancy for our pool is 75 people. This is determined by the fire marshal who takes the volume of water into consideration, Having a shallow pool means less occupancy than our surrounding neighborhood pools. Please be advised that we will hold to the number and on nice days when we get to 60 people we will only allow members in from that point on. Our goal is to provide a pleasant, comfortable and safe place for you to relax and enjoy.

On nice days we may limit guests to accommodate members. Call ahead to find out the pool status.



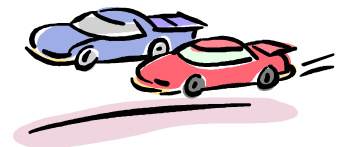
July 4 Safety Reminders from the City of Kirkland



As plans for the July 4th "Celebrate Kirkland!" community event are finalized, the Kirkland Police and Fire Departments encourage residents and visitors to celebrate safely and legally and offer the following tips:

- **Comply with the City's fireworks ban.** The sale, possession and discharge of all fireworks are prohibited within Kirkland city limits. This includes the recently annexed areas of Finn Hill, North Juanita, and Kingsgate.
- **Report fireworks violations.** Persons observing *non-emergency* violations of the fireworks ban should contact NORCOM Police Dispatch at (425) 577-5656 and a Kirkland Police officer will be dispatched when available. In the event of an emergency, please call 9-1-1.
- **Keep pets safe.** Most pets are upset by fireworks and should be kept inside. Report lost and found pets to King County Regional Animal Services at 206-296-7387 (PETS).
- **Carpool if you can.** Many activities are happening in downtown Kirkland and parking may be limited. Visitors are encouraged to carpool, ride transit or use other alternate means of transportation.
- **Observe parking rules.** The parking lot at Marina Park (6 a.m. – midnight), Heritage Park (6 a.m. – 2 p.m.), and Lake Street (6 a.m. -2 p.m.) will be closed on July 4th. Observe the closure of the Marina Park boat launch from 9:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. (for parade) and again 9:30 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. (for fireworks).
- **Respect Kirkland's parks and open spaces.** Alcohol is prohibited in all public spaces, including parks.
- **Stay and enjoy the fireworks show.** Fireworks will blast off at 10:15 p.m. from a barge on Lake Washington and will be viewable from most downtown waterfront parks. Safety zones will be established in and around downtown docks. Viewers are asked to keep clear of the safety zones and remain during the entire pyrotechnic display.

Speeding on 119th Avenue

You may have noticed that the Kirkland Police are enforcing the 25 mph speed limit much more than King County ever did. Shortly before the June 1 annexation date, the Board wrote a letter to the Police Chief asking for increased presence. And it has been much more than expected. We understand one driver was caught doing almost 48 mph. Speeding fines are expensive, to say nothing of the danger you are creating, particularly to the many children in the neighborhood.
